ST. CHRISTOPHER ACADEMY OF NUEVA ECIA, INC.

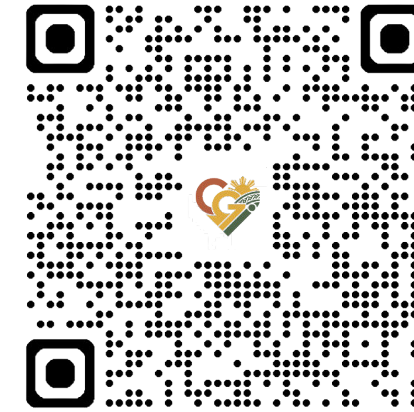

PALITO PERAK

Palito Perak (b. 1984) is an Indonesian contemporary artist born in Bukittinggi, West Sumatra. A graduate of the Indonesian Institute of the Arts in Yogyakarta in Visual Communication Design, his practice explores media, popular imagery, social media, and the blurred boundaries between representation and reality. His works often combine familiar imagery with obscured or distorted elements, examining perception, optimism, and contemporary social issues. In 2023, he received the Gold Award at the UOB Painting of the Year Indonesia.

About the Artist



JUVENAL SANSÓ

Juvenal Sansó (1929–2025) was a Spanish-born modernist artist who spent much of his life in the Philippines and became a significant figure in Philippine art. Known for his richly textured landscapes, florals, and dreamlike coastal scenes, his work was deeply shaped by his wartime experiences in Manila and his later years in Europe. Sansó worked across painting, printmaking, photography, textile design, and stage design, and was awarded the Presidential Medal of Merit for his contributions to Philippine art.

Daniel de la Cruz (b. 1966) is a Filipino contemporary sculptor known for his elegant figurative works in bronze, brass, copper, and steel. His sculptures often depict elongated human forms—particularly women—capturing movement, grace, strength, and emotion through fluid lines and expressive gestures. His distinctive approach to metal sculpture has made his works widely recognized and collected in the Philippines and internationally.

RAMON ORLINA

Ramon Orlina (b. January 27, 1944) is a renowned Filipino sculptor celebrated for pioneering the use of carved glass as a sculptural medium in the Philippines. Originally trained as an architect, Orlina developed a distinctive practice transforming thick blocks of glass into luminous, abstract forms that explore light, movement, and transparency. His works have been exhibited internationally and have established him as one of the Philippines' most recognized contemporary sculptors.
